Mr. Madden – The first clarifier is being re – assembled at this point. That's moving along. I sent Mr. Frank some information we found on flow meters from the State Contract. We're keeping track of capacity; it did come down a little bit in June, the flows were down to 3.16 MGD.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – How much more needs to be done with the clarifiers to complete the project?

Mr. Madden - There are four units in total and we're doing them one at a time. The first one is being re – assembled.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – Will this project need to be shut down when we hit cold weather?

Mr. Madden – Yes. The plan is to get two done this year and two done next year.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – Does this have any benefit from a capacity perspective by having this fourth clarifier on or from an operational perspective?

Mr. Madden – It's going to be more efficient and they will operate better. There may be some things we can do to enhance their performance.

Mr. Frank – Unless you increase the size of the tank, they will be hydraulically overloaded. It won't change our capacity.

Mr. Madden – If you had an expansion, you wouldn't need to expand that particular area, those tanks should be sufficient.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – I think we had that in mind when that fourth one was built because of the next expansion that could occur if one was going to happen. System capacity, we're approaching the 95%, that was the new criteria. Certainly, it poses a problem when we put our paper capacity on top of it.

Mr. Tully – At one point, we talked about taking that one manhole, that 90 degree bend out, are we still going to try to do that or is it not feasible?

Mr. Madden – Behind the IHop. We did an analysis of that and it wouldn't really pick up that much benefit without increasing the size of the line in that particular area.

7. <u>Discussion:</u>

a) 2nd Quarter 2019 Capacity Evaluation

Mr. Madden – This quarter we're still showing we're over the total allocation with the paper capacity. This isn't unusual in recent months; this has been a continuous thing the past five or six quarters. The last month we saw a trend downward which is positive, the flows in June were down a little to a more acceptable level, in my opinion. I printed out a chart of the groundwater table that I found and that is slowly starting to come back to normal levels. It's still high but it's trending down. I think that's going to help us.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – If you look at the next to last page of the report, about halfway down, you have the 30 day average flow, so if you look at the last quarter of 2017, we're at 2.377, we had a couple of low three's and 2.3 but going down beginning in January 2018, 3.6, 3.2, 3.2, 3.8, 3.7, 3.4, so these are significant numbers. These are the actual flows to the plant so on top of that if you go over a couple of columns, the next to last column tells you the quarterly committed flow so you can see we're above our 3.8 rating.

Mr. Tully – If you look at the last one, precipitation, that last quarter is 8.35 for the quarter, then it goes to 11.73, 16, 16, 16.79, 9 then 17, so the rainfall doubled, four out of the next five quarters. That's crazy.

Mr. Madden – Flows in November threw the averages off on a lot of our scales.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – With all that said Mr. Frank, we're still meeting our DEP criteria and we're still compliant with our DEP permit?

Mr. Frank - Yes.

b) The Villages – Pool and Clubhouse

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – They're looking for an additional 2.58 EDUs. Mr. Tully, you were going to look into this?

Mr. Tully – Yes. We pulled the approved plans. They got approval for a pool and two cabanas. Looking at it, it looks like they did what Pulte did, they got the rest of their sewer allocation but forgot to include it. Pulte came back for their's too because they forgot to include it also. I think this is the same situation and they just forgot to think of sewer flow associated with the pool and clubhouse.

Mr. Kendzulak, Jr. – So, it is a fair request.

Mr. Tully – Yes. It would have been included in the original allocation anyway.

Mr. Watts – You'll need a resolution next month, allocating the additional capacity.

8. Adjourn into Closed Session by Motion, if Needed

Chair Kendzulak, Jr. – We will be going into Closed Session to discuss Personnel Issues, and Litigation Matters; we do not anticipate any official action will need to be taken once we come out of Closed Session.
